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## Coding Tip of the Month:

### Diabetes

Assign as many codes from the appropriate category (E08- E13) as needed to identify all the associated diabetic conditions addressed and monitored at time of visit to describe your patient.

Hyperglycemia is no longer considered a symptom of diabetes mellitus and should be noted in the medical record when it exists, as it is a complication of diabetes. Documentation of “*poorly controlled*” or “*out of control*” Diabetes will be reported as Diabetes with Hyperglycemia.

Combination Codes Include type of diabetes mellitus, the body system affected, and the complication affecting that body system. Specific diabetes codes require additional codes to identify the manifestation or complication further. Other specified complications are those that are not specifically covered by other diabetes complication codes, including osteomyelitis, diabetic hyperlipidemia, and other conditions specified by Providers as diabetic complications. Providers should specifically document “diabetic hyperlipidemia” or “hyperlipidemia associate with diabetes” in the note to link these two diagnoses. i.e.

**E11.69 Diabetes with other specified complications – stable, continue taking metformin as rx’d.**

**E78.5 Hyperlipidemia – stable, associated with diabetes, continue taking statin as rx’d.**

**If the type of diabetes mellitus is not documented in the visit note, the diabetes mellitus category will default to E11.-, which is Type 2 diabetes mellitus.**

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## Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month

March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness month. Colorectal cancer rates are rising in seemingly healthy people under the age of 50, and health officials are responding to the alarming trend. [The U.S.](#)

Preventive Services Task Force recently issued new guidelines that recommend colon cancer screening start at age 45 instead of age 50.

The influential panel concluded that starting routine screening five years earlier could prevent more deaths from colorectal cancer, which is the third-leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States.

"Far too many people in the U.S. are not receiving this lifesaving preventive service," said Dr. Michael Barry, the task force's vice chairperson. "We hope that this new recommendation to screen people ages 45 to 49, coupled with our long-standing recommendation to screen people 50 to 75, will prevent more people from dying from colorectal cancer."

Colorectal cancer was projected to kill nearly 53,000 Americans in 2021, according to the task force. Carl Raczkowski, M.D., is a gastroenterologist and the president of INTEGRIS Health Partners. He says he is in favor of anything that can help reduce that number.

"A colonoscopy is a simple test that can have lifesaving results. By opening up this type of screening to more people, we can effectively catch more cancers early and in turn save more lives."

Raczkowski believes everyone should get a colonoscopy at the appropriate age, but especially those who fall in a high-risk category. Rates of colorectal cancer are higher in African Americans, Native Americans and Indigenous Alaskans. They are also higher for people with a family history of colorectal cancer; men; and those with other risk factors, such as obesity, diabetes, history of smoking or unhealthy alcohol use.

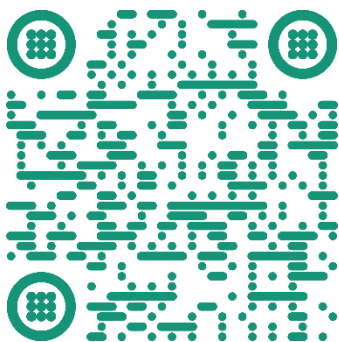
The new recommendation is in line with the advice of the American Cancer Society and other groups. The task force is an independent, volunteer panel of national experts in prevention and evidence-based medicine.

**Tests recommended by the panel are typically covered by insurance, but individuals will need to check their medical insurance benefit policies first as there is a variation in coverage.**

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## Pharmacy Task Force Updates

## **100-day medication supply default for CMS Stars Adherence Measure Medications (change from 90-day default)**

**Rationale:** 100-day supply orders positively impact the triple-weighted medication adherence Stars measures and many Medicare Advantage Plans provide additional incentives for 100-day supply orders. Plans that do not recognize 100-day supply will have days supply changed to 90-days by the pharmacy during claims processing

### **Listing of Stars Measure Medications:**

- **Antihypertensives “RAAS” agents only:** Angiotensin-Converting Enzyme (ACE) Inhibitor (e.g., lisinopril), Angiotensin II Receptor Blockers (e.g., losartan), and Renin inhibitor (aliskiren) as well as combinations
- **Antihyperlipidemics:** Statins and statin combination products (e.g., atorvastatin)
- **Oral antidiabetics:** metformin, sulfonylureas (e.g., glipizide), thiazolidinediones (i.e., pioglitazone), DPP-IV inhibitors (e.g., Januvia), SGLT-2 inhibitors (e.g., Farxiga, Jardiance) including combination products
  - Excluded from 100-day supply initiative but part of adherence measure GLP-1 RA (e.g., Ozempic and dual mechanism Mounjaro) due to packaging limitations from the manufacturers

### **Metformin updates in Epic to improve tolerability and therapy success**

- Preference list addition of cost-effective, easier-to-swallow metformin extended release 500 mg tablet (generic to Glucophage XR 500 mg) and preference list removal of poorly tolerated immediate release tablets 500 mg, 750 mg, 1,000 mg tablets.
- Standardized dose-ramping preference list orders for new starts and rechallenges involving slow dose increase weekly in 500 mg increments with meals up to the selected target dose based on renal function and glycemic goals (max target dose of two, 500 mg ER tablets twice daily with meals).
  - Only the final order results in print to pharmacy and temporary ramping orders show on the Epic AVS and MyChart to trigger patient education.

### **Rationale:**

- Medicare and commercial plans report 50% metformin adherence failure rate partly related to high utilization of the poorly tolerated immediate release tablets and lack of standardized dose-ramping instructions.
- Metformin therapy abandonment in patients with adequate renal function negatively impacts quality and cost of diabetes care.

### **Additional information:**

- Metformin extended release 1,000 mg strength has higher cost and problematically large tablet size. Most patients who ramp up and tolerate 1,000 mg per dose often still prefer to take two of the smaller, 500 mg extended-release tablets. Glumetza brand metformin as well as metformin oral solution is also higher in cost.
  - Metformin improves diabetes control and prevents delay in diabetes progression via multiple mechanisms in a weight-neutral fashion including reduction of insulin resistance and reduction of hepatic glucose production. In those on insulin, metformin reduces insulin-associated weight gain.
  - Diabetes therapy intensification frequently should include the continuation of metformin if patient comorbidities allow.

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## Outmigration

In an effort to advance population health, reduce cost and duplication of services, and improve patient and provider experience, IHP is working to ensure healthcare services in the network are delivered, coordinated, and managed by in-network providers and facilities.

To do so, we have stood up the Outmigration workstream. This program's goal is to optimize referral decision-making and close the referral loop through:
